03 May,2020

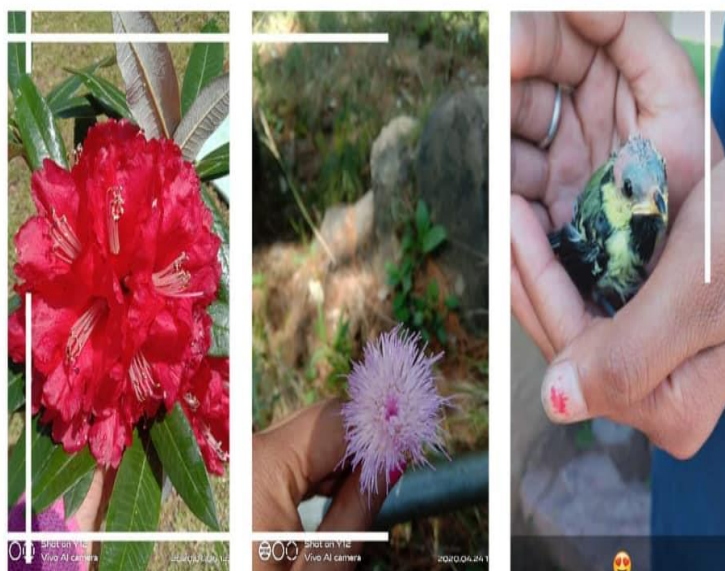

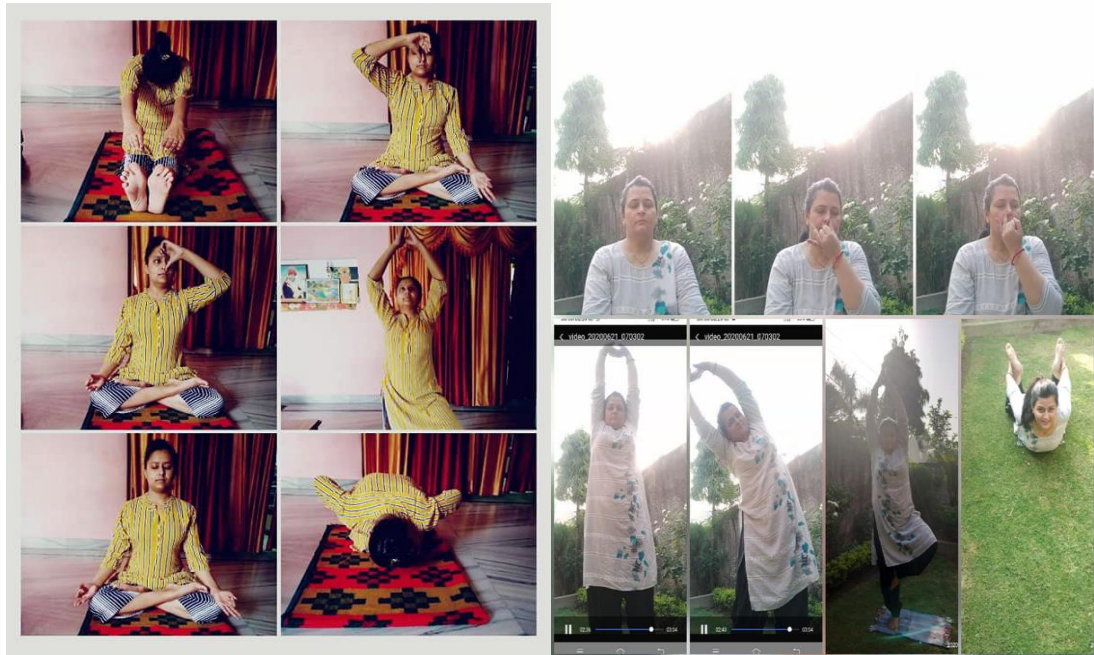
STUDENT ACHIEVE NATIONAL LEVEL AWARD
